

Transportation

Application Process

Applications are currently being accepted. Deadline is 6/1/18. All new students must submit a current IEP at time of application.

Approval is made following review of application, a student interview, funding approval by the School District, and a \$100 non-refundable deposit.

Fees

7-week program - \$4,420
(5 - 16 y/o)

Fee includes IEP goals, and daily group socialization/skills activities.
1:1 staff available for an additional **\$3,250**

Intensive Supports 7-week program - \$7,350

(16-21 y/o) program fee (includes a 1:1) Individual sessions in Speech/ Language, Occupational, and Physical Therapy are available at the additional cost of \$90/session.

Initial payment of \$1,000 required by start of program with the balance due by the end of the program (8/10/18)

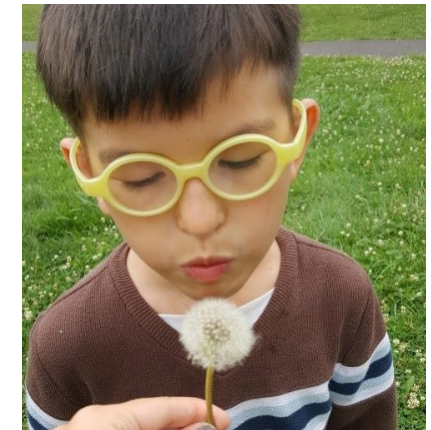

Extended School Year



The Extended School Year (ESY) Program assists students, ages 5-21, with developmental disabilities to maintain and improve skills acquired during the school year throughout the summer months

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Program Mission

To provide a safe and structured educational experience for children with varying disabilities that focuses on social interactions and academic progress while engaging in IEP and group activities.

Career Discovery

For students 14-16. Includes regular IEP goals and related services. Afternoon activities include beginnings exploration and discussion of career areas, work-related skills (money, customer service), job applications and mock interviews. Students also participate in vocational program area one day a week.

Variety Staff

Each classroom is led by a certified special education teacher and includes teaching assistants majoring in teaching or a related field. Therapists are available in Speech, Occupational, and Physical Therapy. Staff are trained in disabilities/special needs, positive behavioral support and have all appropriate clearances.

Intensive Supports

For students 16-21 with high needs in behavior, communication, or personal care. Program is staffed 1:1 and includes daily vocational/ packaging/ assembly activities.

Nurses are on-site 24/7.

Program Components

- 7 week program-6/25 to 8/10 (Set dates)
- High staff/student classroom ratio
- Individualized instruction
- Group social skills/socialization activities
- Two daily reinforcement periods with activities of choice and swimming
- Daily use of the sensory room
- Related Services - Speech and Language Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Physical Therapy
